



DI JONES DIRECTOR

When I first considered directing this play life as we then knew it was very different. I am writing these notes as I recover from Covid and we race towards show week with a certain amount of trepidation.

When I first cast the play, I knew I had picked a strong cast, with years of experience between them, but I had no idea at that point how clever I had been! They are like a well-oiled orchestra who can maintain the momentum when their conductor is temporarily absent only to hand back the baton when necessary

A Bunch of Amateurs is an interesting piece that performs better than it first reads. Once given life, the humour and pathos shine through. Of course, we all hope that The Stratford Players is nothing like our own drama group, but those of you who have followed the Mitre Players for many years may disagree!

Humour is vital to this piece and here the cast excel. The difference between two countries who essentially speak the same language is beautifully illustrated in such misunderstandings as place names, food and nationality characteristics to name but a few. Underlying the humour, the pathos of the relationship between Lear and Cordelia is cleverly mirrored in Jefferson's own relationship with his daughter Jessica, leading to Jefferson's epiphany.

I would like to thank Charles Marriott for making the wonderful film that is used at the beginning of the play. We had such fun making it. Thanks also to the entire backstage team, led by the ever calm Derek Lee, for their support and dedication.

My brief was to produce a comedy to cheer us up after the gloom of the last two years. I think we've done that. Enjoy!



Having played sword wielding Regan in King Lear at the Minack Theatre, Cornwall a few years ago (with Denise Scales) this couldn't be more different!




KATY ROID AURON BOLL


Charles plays Dennis the
