


Julian Chenery (Director/Lyricist) has been a Mitre Player for 25 years, making his debut in October 1984 in *Desert Melody*, our entry in The Art of Coarse Acting Festival: he has been acting coarsely ever since. Known as The Broker (since our 2004 production of *The Hunting of the Snark*), he has appeared with Colin Warnock (The Bellman, ditto) in *Guys and Dolls* (Sky Masterson to Colin's Nathan Detroit), *Chicago* (Billy Flynn to his Mary Sunshine) and *Man of La Mancha* (Spanish (pri)senor to his Don Quixote); directed him in *Just So*, and written with him our recent panto hits *Peter Pan*, *Beauty and the Beast, Robinson Crusoe* and *Sleeping Beauty*.



Their adaptation of *Peter Pan* starring S Club's Jon Lee was the Christmas show at the White Rock Theatre, Hastings in 2008, and this year they have worked together on their version of *Aladdin* at the same venue, with Leslie Grantham as Abanazar and Neil O'Gorman as the Genie. His beautiful wife Carolyn (the March Hare, cf HotS) and all 4 of his kidz have at some stage or another trod the Mitre boards.

Alan Merricks (Assistant Director) Ali Baba is Alan's second outing in the Assistant Director's chair, following on from his successful debut during *Hoy es Fiesta* earlier in 2009 with the mighty Fraser Macdonald, who is equally mighty as this year's dame! Alan cut his teeth in *Cindy Ella* 9 years or so ago, and has appeared in various Mitre shows since. Ali Baba has been a hoot from start to finish, and it has been a pleasure working with such a cast, and of course with Julian and Colin. He owes a debt of gratitude to his long suffering wife, who almost forgot what he looks like, and looks forward to the year and the safe return of his son, Tom, from Afghanistan.



Colin Warnock (Composer and Musical Supervisor) first attended Trinity School in 1965, when it was brand new. After leaving school, he co-founded The Mitre Players and has been involved ever since, though in an ever-

decreasing way! After yet another Christmas holiday spent slaving over a keyboard and a computer, he is as usual vowing never to do it again! His first meeting with Julian Chenery (the Broker) was as Musical Director of a production of **Annie Get Your Gun** at Oxted in 1981, where Broker wore a false chest wig during "Moonshine Lullaby". They have worked together many times since and this is their 5th Mitre collaboration, having previously written **Beauty and the Beast**, **Peter Pan**, **Robinson Crusoe** and **Sleeping Beauty**. For 27 years, Colin has worked at Laine Theatre Arts in Epsom, helping to train the stars of tomorrow.



Ian Brown (Bashim) Apart from two performances as an absent Julia Gibbs (including wearing her dress) in Sleeping Beauty, Ian hasn't been seen in a Mitre Panto since playing the confused Humpty Dumpty/Bruno The Bear in *Robinson Crusoe* five years ago. Despite appearing in numerous pantos over the last 27 years, Ian has never played a baddie before (as far as he can remember), so it's great fun to be nasty and to play opposite the slightly more Eastern and ever so slightly more youthful Grabbit. Ian hopes you're all in good voice for the show - oh no he doesn't!

Ann Bowden (Alsatia) Bearing the title of Queen Mother of The Mitre Players, Ann feels it is fitting for her to play the role of "Evil Queen". She has never before had the joy of playing a Panto "Baddie" and is looking forward to plenty of booing and hissing from the audience. She hopes her canine "growl" will not terrify the kiddies!





Livvy Chenery (Scherezade) has been a member of The Mitre Players her whole life, taking part in many productions over the years, her favourites being the Zebra in *Just So* (Minack), a Ronnette in *Little Shop of* Horrors, and ensemble in The Hunting of the Snark. Livvy has played Ophelia in *Hamlet*, Ariel in *The Tempest* and Lady Montague in Romeo and Juliet for Shakespeare 4 Kidz National and International tours. She is a member of the National Youth Theatre, where most recently she played Colleen in the world premiere of *Out of Me* in London's Soho Theatre. Livvy is thoroughly looking forward to the run of Ali Baba and hopes you enjoy the show.



Mark Curtis (Ali Baba) When Mark first saw that the Mitres were doing Ali Baba as this year's panto, he did a little research. Fat, balding, middle aged man from Baghdad - he knew that this was the role that he was born to! Mark is relishing the chance to jump around on stage again, having spent the last two years in the exile of Accountancy Land! Never was there a more dull and desolate place. Mark also now has a 14 year old slave girl!

Greg Elder (Prince Haroun) is 17 years old and currently studying for A Levels at The John Fisher School. From a young age, Greg has been interested in sport. Studying theatre at A Level, Greg hopes that this will help him to perform well in this production. Greg also hopes he will not be upstaged by his father. This is Greg's first production as a Mitre.

Alan Geeson (Mustafa) Appearing only once before on the Mitre stage, performing as a chorus member in last year's Christmas production of *Uncle Ebenezer*, Alan has been given the

opportunity to play a principal character as Mustafa Screwloose, Fatima's house boy. Currently on a gap year from education, Alan plans to go on to university to study broadcasting technology within the television media.

Alex Greenslade (Sultan) This year is Alex's 25th anniversary of joining the Mitres. Although he usually has an aversion to pantomimes, this time he was keen to avoid having to manage Front of House yet again, so he told the directors he would be pleased to be involved if his part had fewer than 50 lines. It has only 14, so he is delighted! He hopes to invent a line-learning machine.

Jim Hammond (Grand Vizier) Jim was born in Surrey. He then grew up, was educated, played rugby and appeared on 'Blind Date' all in Surrey. He is anything but a home bird as he regularly visits Kent and Sussex. He has revived his association with the Mitre Players so that he can legitimately make a fool of himself and chauffeur 2/3 of his children to rehearsals. He now lives and works in Surrey.



Helen Harries-Rees (Catarina) Helen has been a Mitre Player for too many years, although she hasn't been in a pantomime for a long long time. She was recently seen on stage as an Irish schoolgirl in our production of *Daisy Pulls It Off* and played the lovely Mrs Cratchitt in *Uncle Ebenezer* last Christmas. Helen is delighted to be performing in *Ali Baba*, as the Arabian theme reminds her of her younger belly dancing days. Helen is a full time mother to Megan and David, and in her spare time she works for DHL (AND NO, SHE DOESN'T DRIVE THE LORRIES!!!!!).


Megan Harries-Rees (Princess Jasmine)

Megan has recently moved back home after two and a half years, and is returning to the Mitre stage as the beautiful Egyptian Princess Jasmine (no acting or makeup required!!!). Megan has been a Mitre Player her entire life, her favourite role being the all-singing, all dancing Kangaroo in Just So at the Minack Theatre. Megan feels that the amount of Turkish kebabs she has eaten. camels she has ridden and mosques she has attended, has really helped her make the most of this role. She would like to thank her boyfriend Andrew for flying her to and from rehearsals on his magic carpet!!!

Patrick Isbell (Musical Director) After managing to graduate from Trinity College of Music without getting thrown out, Patrick worked on productions of *Grease is the Word, The Lion King, Fiddler on the Roof, Seven Brides* and *Les Miserables* as well as far too many am

-drams for him to now be considered normal. As an additional punishment he works with Colin Warnock as the other half of the music department at Laine Theatre Arts. This is Pat's first outing for the Mitre Players and he is sure he will have a wonderful time!

Saskia Jiggens (Marjana) In the last 2 years, Saskia was a proud pupil in *Happiest Days*, a sad sister in *My Boy Jack*, a tortured teenager in *Hoy Es Fiesta* and a darling daughter in *Little Women*. Now perhaps the alliterative character of a lifetime - a sensationally spiffing slavegirl! What glittering thespian peaks remain unconquered? When asked about her most loquacious and laudable acting roles, the panto audience could shout "They're behind you"...



Fraser Macdonald (Fatima Fandango)

From the sublime to the ridiculous! After breaking new ground by translating and directing a Spanish play for its first production in English last April, Fraser now appears as the Mitre Players' pantomime dame for the umpteenth time in this production of Ali Baba. Retired from heading the Spanish Department at Trinity School, he is now (in his spare time) Chief Examiner in Spanish for a major examinations board. Last year he played Scrooge in the Christmas production of *Uncle Ebenezer* but is now dusting off his frocks and bras to grace the stage once again as the traditional transvestite. Set in Baghdad, he is certain that this production will help to promote understanding and tolerance between the east and the west - but watch out for his weapons of mass destruction!

Joe Pepper (Grabbit) was recently let out of prison in the Middle East and on return to England decided to use the skills that he had picked up there to play the role of Grabbit in *Ali Baba and the Forty Thieves*. Joe has been a Mitre for 5 years now as well as being involved with Trinity School drama. Joe's favourite role was Lucky Eric in *Bouncers*, but his double act with Bashim has been WOO-nderful fun. To help get into character Joe has been watching Borat, learning Arabic, and drinking MilkSHEIKS. He warns you all to not boo and hiss - otherwise Bashim and him will have to do some 'cutting, shredding and, beheading.'

Lucy Thompson (Choreographer) is delighted to be making her choreographic debut for the Mitre Players this year. She has been a lifelong member and has performed in numerous shows, the most recent being *Daisy Pulls It Off*. Lucy has studied many forms of dance and during the rehearsal process completed her exams and is now a fully qualified tap dancer. When asked how she intends to use this she responded, 'to choreograph more things for the Mitres'. She must be enjoying it!
