Director's Notes

Taking a much loved musical and trying to make it a little different is never an easy task. *Bugsy Malone* is the film we all grew up with and the show 'anybody who is anybody' has been a part of as a child! But beneath the splurge and jazz hands, always so innocently portrayed by children, lies a more sinister and passionate story - one that we have had the pleasure of being able to explore with an all adult cast and one we hope will give you a fresh take on the popular version.

I hope you all enjoy watching the show as much as I have had creating it. Thanks to everyone involved in the making of it - it has been an absolute blast! Good luck if you're sitting in the splash zone!

Director, writer, producer SIR ALAN PARKER, born Islington, February 14th, 1944, began his career in advertising as a copywriter and graduated to writing and directing



PAUL WILLIAMS was born September 19, 1940, in Omaha, Nebraska. After a medical condition stunted his growth, he considered becoming a jockey,

commercials where in the late 60's he was one of a small group of British directors who revolutionized world advertising. In 1974, Parker directed the BBC Television film, **The Evacuees**, written by Jack Rosenthal. He wrote and directed his first feature film, **Bugsy Malone**, in 1976. The film received five British Academy Awards. His second film was the controversial **Midnight Express** (1977) which won two Oscars and six Academy Award nominations, including one for Parker as Best Director . Subsequent films included, **Shoot the**

Moon, Pink Floyd - The Wall, Birdy and

Mississippi Burning.

however his love of music and theatre won out .

The Commitments, made in 1990, a story of a young Irish working-class soul band, was awarded a Golden Globe Nomination for Best Picture and won Parker the Best Director prize at the Tokyo Film Festival, as well as British Academy Awards for Editing, Screenplay, Director and Best Picture. In 1996, Parker directed, wrote and produced Evita based on the successful stage show by Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice, and starring Madonna, Antonio Banderas and Jonathan Pryce, The film won three Golden Globe Awards, including Best Picture. Angela's Ashes based on the Pulitzer Prize winning, best selling memoir by Frank McCourt, was written and directed by Alan Parker in 1999, starring Emily Watson and Robert Carlyle.

After a relatively unsuccessful career as an actor (he auditioned for "The Monkees", but wasn't cast) and comedy writer, he joined A & M Records as a staff songwriter. There he wrote songs such as *Out in the Country* for Three Dog Night and *We've Only Just Begun* and *I Won't Last a Day Without You* for The Carpenters.

A founding member of the Directors Guild of Great Britain, in 1984 he was honoured by the British Academy with the prestigious Michael Balcon Award for Outstanding Contribution to British Cinema. In November, 1995 Parker was awarded with a CBE by Queen Elizabeth II for services to the British film industry and he received a knighthood in 2002.

Other hits include *Rainy Days and Mondays*, *Evergreen* from the 1976 version of A Star is Born and *Rainbow Connection* from the 1979 movie The Muppet Movie.

Paul has written music for many films including *Phantom of the Paradise* (1974), *Bugsy Malone* (1976), *Thunderbolt and Lightfoot* (1976), *Smokey and the Bandit* and *Ishtar* (1987).

After appearing in Phantom of the Paradise singing his own songs, he started to appear in films and TV shows as a supporting actor in shows and films such as *Hawaii Five-O*, *The Muppet Movie*, *The Odd Couple*, *Star Trek Voyager*, *Hart to Hart* and *Goliath*.

He wrote the music to the stage version of *Happy Days* (2007) and has written songs for the French electronic duo Daft Punk.

In addition to his work as a songwriter and performer, Paul is also the President and Director of ASCAP (American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers), one of America's leading performing rights organisations, and is an outspoken advocate for the rights of songwriters and artists in the digital age.

Iulia Gent: Velma



Mike Lilley: Fat Sam



We are a very friendly and sociable society, presenting three or four productions a year in a wide variety of venues. Putting on a show not only requires people on stage, but also involves a great deal of hard work behind the scenes. We design, build and paint our own sets, find and make our own props, make many of our own costumes and use "in house" musicians whenever possible.
