



MEET THE TEAM

JULIA ASCOTT (Script Adaptation) directed the original Cindy-Ella in 1990. She has taken part in numerous Mitre Pantomimes but decided she was too old to be in this one! She's old enough to be mother to half the chorus - in fact she is mother to half of them! Mind you. Julia has come to the conclusion that it is far less stressful being on stage than it is being in charge of the Children's Chorus.

JAMES BEAL (Assistant Musical Director) Cindv-Ella is James' fifth Mitre Show, previous highlights including Merrily We Roll Along and The Millennium Dame. Elsewhere, he has been involved in Godspell (Trinity School, 1997) and **Little Shop of Horrors** (Chipstead Juniors) last April. During the day, James works as a Graphic Designer. In the evenings (outside of Panto season) he's available for weddings, bar mitzvahs, etc.)

KELLY BEARD (Mary Lou) has been a Mitre Player since

she was 14 years old. Kelly is thrilled that she is not playing the juvenile lead this vear! Her most recent role was that of Mary Pickford in The Biograph Girl but she says her favourite part to date has been that of Sharon in A Slice of Saturday Night.

ALEX BOUD (Prince Benny) attends Oxted County School. This is his Mitre Players debut but previous productions have included Bugsy Malone, Cuba and Living with Lady **Macbeth.** He is currently studying for his Drama GCSE.

IAN BROWN (Faith)

is a little concerned to be appearing in women's clothing for two years running. But at least the nasty Faith is a huge contrast (he hopes) to last year's nice Widow Twanky. Ian is directing our junior production of Guys and **Dolls** in April 2001, so he's been using the rehearsals to size up the talent of the teenage members. Ooh er!


CLARE DEMPSEY (Cindy-Ella) This is Clare's first show with the Mitre Players. Her first performance was for the Younger Generation Theatre Group at the Ashcroft Theatre, Croydon when she was seven years old and she has continued to perform with them since. She has also taken part in several school productions at St. Philomena's where she is a pupil.

piana Dobson (Charity) is one of the original Mitre Players having played Kitty Verdun in Charley's Aunt in 1973 and Randolph the Cat in Cinderella Charleston in 1974. Her last pantomime was Dame Sherlock in 1987 when she played the Princess von Heineken. Her favourite role has been Jean Brodie (The Prime of Miss Jean Brodie, 1982). Diana works for 'Accountancy' magazine.

JONATHAN FAINT (Rickie Charming) has been acting from a young age and hopes to go to drama college next year. He has taken part in many Trinity productions and some may remember him as Mr Burdekin from the joint Trinity/Mitre Players production of **Turnabout!** He also performs with West

Wickham Operatic Society at the Churchill Theatre. He is currently rehearsing for **South Pacific** in January and **Oklahoma** in May 2001.

PAUL GRACE (Prince Bill) is a student teacher and gym coach, having left Trinity School in July. His first appearance for us was in 1998 as a clown in Turnabout! Since than, he has played Paul/Terry in A Slice of Saturday Night, 'Boy' in The Country Wife and Mack Sennett in The Biograph Girl. Paul is an accomplished gymnast and juggler.



HELEN HARRIES-REES (Director) A Mitre Player since 1985 (Backstage) she has directed numerous shows including Me and My Girl and Guys and Dolls (Ashcroft Theatre), 42nd **Street** (Churchill Theatre), Godspell (Epsom Playhouse) and The Wizard of Oz and Man of La Mancha (Minack Theatre, Cornwall). Having started acting at an early age, Helen is delighted that her 12 year old daughter, Megan, is showing the same interest. Helen has found this production particularly challenging due to the tender ages of many of the cast.

MEGAN HARRIES-REES
(Mini Me Fairy) has been a member of the Mitre Players since 1988. She has appeared in many Mitre Player pantomimes and several productions, including Gretel (Sound of Music), Frank Junior (Merrily We Roll Along). She has also recently performed in a production at the Fairfield Halls and the at The Millennium Dome.

RICHARD JONES (Mini Me Demon King) This is Richard's third Mitre production, the other two being **Turnabout!** (Roly) and **The Millennium Dame** (TDS.2). This is his first alongside his father (which allows him to act as his prompt!) A Trinity choirboy, he has appeared in **A Midsummer Night's Dream** with the Rome
National Opera and is therefore a fully qualified 'fairy'.

WARWICK JONES (The Demon King). After 26 years in the Mitre Players Warwick has reached immortality now as 'Richard's Dad'. Too old now to remember lines, he enjoys Panto as it allows him to ad lib without upsetting the rest of the cast too much. He played the same part in 1990 but can recall nothing about it.

Coody) Liz played Cindy-Ella the first time around and is devastated that she is (finally) too old to play the part again. As the Fairy Godmother this time, she will make sure Cindy-Ella gets her fella, although she says she would never let her sons Matthew (3) and Oliver (6 months) marry a pop star!

PAUL LONGHURST

(Buttons) This is Paul's first pantomime, but he's no stranger to the stage! Regular Mitre audiences will remember Paul as D.W. Griffith in our production of The Biograph Girl. Other roles have included Romeo, Barnum, Salieri (Amadeus), and most recently Gary (A Slice of Saturday Night).

FRASER MACDONALD

(Hope) is no stranger to Pantomime, having appeared in roles as diverse as King Rat, Dame and the Mad Professor. This year he's happy to be cross-dressing once again as an Ugly Sister (no, the Mitre Players are not economising on make-up!). When he's not putting on women's clothing, Fraser teaches Spanish at Trinity School.


ALAN MERRICKS (Dan

Dean) was persuaded to take part by his daughter, Emily, who is in the chorus. Alan has done nothing on stage since leaving Trinity School. His last school production was Hamlet in 1974 where he played the part of Laertes. He is thoroughly enjoying the pantomime and can't wait for another go.

CATHY NEWITT (Peggy-

Sue) is still playing the 17 year old roles for the Mitres but her aim is to play at least 20 in the near future! She will of course be devoting her time to Paul Longhurst, her fiancee whom she is due to marry in October, so this will be one of her last appearances for a while.

MARK PEARSE (Prince Bobby) is usually found backstage, but after eight years of lighting, sound and stage management he was challenged to get up front of stage. His most recent work includes follow-spotting for West Wickham Operation Society's productions of Oliver and Sweeney Todd, both at the Churchill Theatre. He is delighted to have been invited to join such a lively and enthusiastic society, with some amazing characters both on and off stage!



LORRAINE TITCHENER

(Doris) This is Lorraine's third Mitre Pantomime and she is delighted to be fulfilling her lifelong ambition of playing an 'Old Doris' . . . not that she's old - you understand! Other parts include Lady Jacqueline (Me and My Girl) and Jane (Salad Days).

MARTIN TYRRELL

(Author/Lyricist) helped to found The Mitre Players 27 years ago. Since then, he has continued to write, direct and occasionally act for the company, he has also directed for CODA, Croydon Histrionic, Croydon Stagers, Surrey Opera and other groups. Since 1994, he has been kept off the streets by running Harrow School's Rvan Theatre where he is also head of Drama, keen docu-soap fans may glimpse him during Carlton's new series on the School. His next production is his first child, due very soon, which is why he & his wife Jessica may not make it to this revival of Cindy-Ella. But he 🜙 sends his kind regards.

NICHOLAS UGLOW (Prince Buddy) Although this is Nicholas's first show with the Mitres he is no stranger to the stage at Trinity having been in Hamlet, The Tempest, Millennium Stories and The Nativity, all directed by Eric Jones.

COLIN WARNOCK

(Composer / Musical **Director**) started at Trinity School in the same form as Martin Tyrrell, when they were 11. He was a founding member of the Mitre Players back in 1973 and has continued to be involved, wearing a multitude of hats, ever since. He has written original scores for some 15 pantomimes and 4 fulllength musicals, mainly with Tyrrell. In addition, he has musically updated Gilbert & Sullivan's **The Mikado** and **H.M.S. Pinafore.** Colin is a professional musician and runs a Keyboards/Drum duo Two in a Bar—suitable for all occasions. He also works at the Laine Theatre Arts College for performing arts in Epsom, where he helps to train stars of tomorrow.
