

CHAIRMAN'S LETTER



The Mitre Players are pleased to welcome you to our production of **One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest**, which we are staging again 20 years after its first outing in this theatre.

We are dedicating this production to the memory of Steve Humfress, who so memorably played the part of McMurphy in 1994, as well as designing a brilliant set and publicity materials. He sadly died suddenly in 2012, but we are pleased that Felicity, his widow and the director of that production (which won the South East England Festival of Drama), is due to pay us a visit from Norfolk, where they had moved some years previously.

Many people are familiar with the story and will have seen the film version, which featured Jack Nicholson in the leading role. It is a dramatic piece, with many tense moments, and of course deals with the still rather taboo subject of mental illness. It represents a challenge for director and actors alike and those involved have risen to that challenge.

The Mitres are versatile and well able to cope with this change of gear, having in December staged the comedy *The Flint Street Nativity*, where adults performed a children's nativity. Once this production is over, we turn our attentions to our greatest challenge for while, since we are among the first amateurs to be performing *Monty Python's Spamalot* and have been chosen to perform it at the Minack Theatre in Cornwall, near Land's End. Although currently it will not be possible for the public to see it in Croydon, if you feel up to the journey, tickets are available via the Minack's website, www.minack.com. We will be there from Monday 18th to Friday 22nd August.

Now, I invite you to sit back and enjoy this evening's show.

Dave Price (Director/Aide Turkle)

You don't have to be mad to be a Mitre Player but it sure helps and Dave has been around long enough now to be thoroughly 'moonstruck'! In his first year as a Mitre he played Billy Bibbit in an award winning production of this very play. Since then he has designed and built sets, acted, directed, choreographed - I kid you not! - and played bass for the Mitres in everything from pantomimes to period dramas and all things in-between. His personal highlights on stage have been Daffyd in **A Chorus of Disapproval**, Teddy in **House and Garden** and the sumptuously uniformed Fitzroy in **Madness of George III**. His personal directorial highlight was **The Long and the Short and the Tall** but he rates the successful polishing of the highly unpromising **Boogie Nights** to make it even slightly stageworthy amongst his greatest achievements! He ended up directing **One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest** when **Journey's End** became unavailable but working on a challenging production with a much larger cast has been brilliant and...as ever...he's entirely failed to keep off the stage. Watch out for a small cameo!

Paul Bowles (Randle P. McMurphy)

Paul has always said "people involved in drama are bonkers!". He still stands by that statement and includes himself in it too. Paul runs his own signwriting business where he often spends long hours facing a wall painting other people's names. If that is not enough to drive him potty, then to spend his evenings playing a character based in a "nut house", certainly will. Before Paul got the role of McMurphy, he had already committed to being the set designer and now feels like he should be committed. He is currently installing a seclusion room in his home in Westerham...







Peter Bramwell (Aide Warren)

This is Peter's first Mitre production since the 4 lines he had in **Boogie Nights** 5 years ago. (Has it really been that long?) The play requires a character who is insecure, dense, and probably more in need of psychiatric treatment than any of the inmates he monitors. Peter was considered perfect for the role.



Ian Brown (Martini)

In 31 years in the Mitre Players, this is one of the strangest roles Ian has played. Martini is on stage most of the time but rarely speaks and being so silent certainly doesn't come naturally to Ian. In stark contrast, Ian is appearing in **Yes Prime Minister** in three weeks' time in Walton on the Hill and playing Sir Humphrey Appleby, a character who almost never stops talking. Ian thought he was getting too old to do two shows at the same time, but somehow it seems to have happened again.





Paul Cohen (Cheswick)

It has been over three years since Paul last tread the boards in Mitre's production of *Our House*. In recent years Paul has taken on the mantle of choreographer and assistant director, including *The Wedding Singer* and *Boogie Nights* for Mitre, and *Seussical* and *Little Shop of Horrors* for CODA. He is very excited to be back on stage performing, though this time he is playing the part of a volatile, voyeuristic middle aged man rather than an energetic and youthful dancer! He will next be seen in Mitre's forthcoming production of *Spamalot* this summer.

Peter Davis (Chief Bromden)

This is Peter's fourth show with The Mitre Players and is delighted to be playing such a 'big' character with a very talented cast. Peter has previously played Ariel in **Return to the Forbidden Planet** and George in **The Wedding Singer**. Peter has also performed with CODA and other local groups in parts such as Angel in **Rent** and Man in Chair in **The Drowsy Chaperone**. Peter has found Chief Bromden a very interesting part to play as it allows him to show his outer 'silence'.



Paul Falconer (Dale Harding)

Paul is delighted to be making his Mitre Players debut in this challenging and thought-provoking play. This marks a rare excursion away from his home society of Epsom Players where he has been heavily involved for the past ten years. Recent credits include Jim Haller in *All Shook Up*, Cinderella's Prince in *Into the Woods*, Moose in *Crazy for You and* Ben in *Follies*. Paul has also directed *The Anniversary*, *Bouncers* and *Shakers* for Epsom Players. He would like to thank his wife Laura for her support and for not having too much in common with Dale Harding's wife!

Paul Grace (Billy Bibbit)

Insanity seems to have followed Paul through his Mitre career. He has performed in the nonsensical Hunting of the Snark, crash landed in a spaceship on the planet D'Illyrium in Return to the Forbidden Planet (twice!) and played a scatologically obsessed member of the 'Academy' (read 'asylum'!) in Gulliver's Travels. After Cuckoo's Nest he'll go on to play Patsy in Spamalot before starting training as a drama teacher: he really must be mad!



Simon Kelly (Aide Williams)

Simon has been interested in acting and performing all his life. He played various instruments in a rock band during the eighties and nineties and even managed to get his songs played on the radio (although it was local radio and he was the DJ at the time so that probably doesn't count). While living in Australia he took acting lessons and appeared in a few amateur films before making his stage debut at Playlovers, WA, in 2010. He played Trevor in a production of **Bedroom Farce** and was able to provide a convincing British accent alongside his Aussie peers. He is looking forward to trying out an American accent for his debut appearance with the Mitre Players.



Fraser Macdonald (Dr. Spivey)

Now retired from teaching at Trinity School, Fraser spends his time as a Chief Examiner in Spanish for a major examinations board as well as finding time to keep up his involvement with the Mitre Players. At an unguarded moment he agreed to play the role of Dr. Spivey, the psychiatrist. We think he needs his head examined!

Megan McMahon (Sandra)

Always more of a magpie than a cuckoo, Megan flew north for the winters seeking shinier pastures. Hatched in South Africa, this is her first of, hopefully, many performances with the Mitre Players. Prone to random outbreaks of madness, if born a few decades earlier she would be a prime study for electric shock therapy.



Owen Moore (Ruckley)

Owen is looking forward to doing his second production with Mitre Players, having played several parts in The Wedding Singer. Most recently, he was in **Rent** at the Secombe Theatre, but has been making a general fool of himself since he was knee high to a leprechaun. He joined CODA in January 2009 and alongside being a 'chorus filler', played Ali Hakim in Oklahoma!, Rogers in Agatha Christie's And Then There Were None. Edmund Swetenham in Agatha Christie's A Murder Is Announced and Chino in **West Side Story.** Other productions include A Man Of No Importance at the Barn Theatre in Oxted.



Tamsin Reeve (Nurse Ratched)

Having been a Mitre for over eight years, this is only Tamsin's third play following *Timing* and a last minute involvement as Jess in *The Flint Street Nativity* - our most recent production. More often found dancing in Mitre pantos and musicals, Tamsin has enjoyed the more analytical rehearsal process and unraveling the preconceptions surrounding this character. See her after for Thorazine, Prozac or E.S.T! Ps, 'when dealing with the insane, the best method is to pretend to be sane'.



Jolyon Roberts (Scanlon)

Jolyon Roberts returns to the stage for the first time in many years to play Scanlon one of the few 'committed' patients on the ward. The reason for his forced incarceration is never explained but could be due to society's fears about being blown sky high? Jolyon has an association with the Mitre Players stretching back many years and has previously played, among others, Le Bret in *Cyrano de Bergerac* and Pitt the younger in *The Madness of George III* - his favourite play. None of these plays could be described as 'a laugh a minute' and Jolyon wonders what it is that makes people think of him when casting miserable roles? When not treading the boards, Jolyon is an Executive Headteacher responsible for a number of primary schools and dad to prospective future Mitre Players Evie and Joseph.

Beci Sageman (Candy Starr)

Beci is a Mitre musical regular having played many roles such as Miranda in **Return** to the Forbidden Planet, Sarah in **Our House** and Holly in **The Wedding Singer**. This is Beci's first play so she must remember to speak and not sing her lines! She is pleased that she is one of the only 'sane' members of this cast.

Eve Simpson (Nurse Flinn)

Eve has been committed, er, I mean, a member of the Mitres for longer than she can remember (the meds must be kicking in). Her previous personalities include Sue in A Slice of Saturday Night, and Ruth in Calendar Girls. Eve is also a regular script writer and director of extra cheesy pantomimes, though she's not planning on giving up her day job any time soon! She hopes that you enjoy your group therapy..."
