

### Chairman's Letter

Following on from our success with The Madness of George III in 2003, we felt it was time for another large scale dramatic piece. Cyrano de Bergerac is a production of epic proportions so we were delighted to have the lovely and very able Di Jones leading the cast as Director. As you will see, we have a large company of about thirty appearing on stage and many more costumes and wigs! There is also, of course, a special appearance by 'the nose'.

There is an element of nostalgia for some of us as 36 years ago Warwick Jones, Colin Warnock and I were all involved in a previous production of Cyrano, whilst still at Trinity School. In fact, I still have some photos of the show somewhere...

Our pantomime just after Christmas, Sir Merryman, is an Arthurian pantomime with Knights, Wizards, a cast of thousands and all the usual Mitre Panto jollity. Originally performed by us in the early eighties, the show was written by Martin Tyrrell and Colin Warnock. Those of you who sat through over three hours of it in 1983 will be pleased to hear it has now been edited and brought up to date for us by Julian Chenery (who successfully penned our last three pantomimes).

Over Easter we will be embarking upon another joint venture with the Trinity School to perform **Oliver**, a show with many well known tunes and another huge cast. This gives us

the opportunity to stage a show we could not do by ourselves and reinforce our links with the School. We will hopefully swell our Junior section as more boys 'get the bug'.

Next year we will once again be touring to the open air Minack Theatre in Cornwall where we are excited to be staging **Just So** by Stiles and Drewe (of Honk! fame). This will be another challenging show and we are looking forward to it immensely.

The Mitre Players often stage shows, which are not the tried and tested diet of productions approached by many other societies. Indeed, this is one of our major strengths.

We are always interested in welcoming new members and accepting offers of help from friends and colleagues. If you wish to be involved with any of our forthcoming shows, in any capacity, we would be pleased to hear from you.

Finally, I would like to thank you, our audiences, for your continued support and hope you enjoy tonight's show.



DI JONES: Director. Known to most Mitre Players as Richard's mum, or Warwick's wife, Di first directed for the Mitres in 1984. Last year she returned, after years of treading the boards for other societies, to co-direct and choreograph Stepping Out and this year she is delighted to be directing the fantastic cast in Cyrano De Bergerac. She is lucky enough to have played her favourite role, Mrs Lovett, in Sondheim's Sweeney Todd, twice; first for The Lyric Players and then for Surrey Opera. Since then she has concentrated on her other favourite role, drama teacher, at Lodge School in Purley. Earlier this year, following the success of Stepping Out, Di started a tap class once a week at the Old Mid's Clubhouse. She intends to carry on as long as her knees hold out!





WARWICK JONES: Cyrano. As a Mitre Player for over 30 years he should have known better than to attempt to learn so many words at his age. Last seen as George in the The Madness of ..... he is considering a course on mime. Warwick was in Cyrano in 1969 when he played the pretty one, Christian that is, in the Trinity School play.

JULIA BASSETT: Roxane. Last seen as Lady Manley-Prowe in Something's Afoot in Dawlish. Yet again she is cast opposite Ian Brown (De Guiche) trying to win her affections. Despite an array of different wigs, make up, costumes and sets he won't be put off! Delighted to be cast as Roxane loved by not just one but three men. If only that were true! Somewhat petulant and self centred some might say 'no acting required!'. Perfect credentials however for being on the Mitre Players' Committee.



IAN BROWN: De Guiche. Ian is delighted to be playing a "baddie" in this production and hopes that's not how he will be seen in the next two shows, Sir Merryman and Oliver, both of which he is directing. Ian is having a non-stop Mitre life having also had a marvellous time playing Nigel in Something's Afoot in Croydon and Dawlish during the summer.





NEIL O'GORMAN: Christian. Neil's life story is the stuff of legends, but you have to be there really to appreciate it, so we won't bother going in to it now. He would like to dedicate his performance to all the wigs, beards and false noses that died during the making of this production.
