

Customary answer to the question "what's happened/" or "what's wrong?"

JULIA ASCOTT is far too old to be playing a teenage flower-seller, having been a Mitre Player for some 26 years. Still, she's a trooper and takes everything you throw at her, literally!

NATHAN ASCOTT is the youngest member of tonight's cast, at 5 years old. Mitre Players will remember him for the "shoe" moment in Millennium Dame last Christmas. Nathan attends Ridgeway Primary School.

OLIVER ASCOTT big brother of the above, shares the same birthday as the Director so he's a good bloke!!! Oliver is 6 and also attends Ridgeway Primary School.

JAMES BACKWAY is the only member of the cast who was moved to tears by the Director during rehearsals. Baby James, who is the son of our drummer, Craig, is 7 and attends Gresham School.

JOHN BARTLE Still holding the honorary title of 'Lord Sanderstead', John will portray the vital role of Dr. Legg, which he will do with his customary skill and panache!

KELLY BEARD has always enjoyed getting her teeth into men's parts. During rehearsals, her voice has dropped two octaves – must give up the hormones! Kelly is a secondary school teacher in New Addington.

TOM BENTLEY is making his Mitre debut and, though far too talented and good-looking, has fitted in with us rather well. Tom left Trinity last summer and is a traince engineer during his 'gap' year. Yes, we shall lose him again soon.

KATHERINE BOTTOMLEY has inevitably, after 8 years of playing tarts and prostitutes, ended up pregnant. She should have taken precautions (like joining another theatre group!) Katherine works as a Sales Office Manager in Oxted.

IAN BROWN has attended only 3 rehearsals for this production — and it shows! Listen for his high voice and watch out for his characteristic 'Jan' walk. (I don't, do I?)

SIR MICHAEL CHEESMAN makes a couple of cameo appearances tonight and is included in crowd scenes to make the stage look full. I think you'll agree that he succeeds. Michael comes to us direct from his holiday.

DENNIS COOMBS is playing his largest role ever for Mitres – we were a bit short on talent – but, I tell you what, he's done us proud! Dennis is married to Eileen but he has enjoyed his new relationship with Fraser.

EILEEN COOMBS has been a Mitre Player for 20 years and has been married to Dennis for a helluva lot longer! Tonight, Eileen plays several character parts and is using all her experience to make them all different.

CIARA DALY returns to us, having been a dwarf at Christmas. Due to rehearsal clashes, Ciara has had special coaching from her mother – a renowned expert in song and dance! Ciara is 6 and attends Margaret Roper Primary School.

GRACE EAGERS enjoys a good drama and is making her 3rd Mitte appearance, following in the footsteps of her mother who was in our 1st ever production. Grace will be 9 this coming Sunday and attends Ridgeway Primary School.

PHIL EVANS is usually late for rehearsals or doesn't turn up. He is also missing Wednesday's performance completely, which accounts for his limited stage appearances. Phil works for Sky News.

MARTIN GARNETT was the Demon King in our 1st pantomime in 1974. He's never had as many lines since – until tonight! Will he remember everybody's name? Will we be able to understand him? Good luck, Martin!

JULIA GIBBS is in her 22nd year as a Mitre Player and to mark this occasion has been issued with a large part in the short play but only about 4 lines in the musical – we know her limitations!

HELEN HARRIES-REES paid her subscription specially to play the part of Peggy – the chance of a lifetime! She is mother to Megan and to David who has appeared more often on stage in rehearsals than anybody else! Helen works for Sodexho...who?

MEGAN HARRIES-REES wanted to sing solo tonight – so her dream is fulfilled, though she had hoped we would be performing 'The Megan Harries-Rees show'. Megan is 12 and attends Riddlesdown High School.

CAROL HARRINGTON has spent the last few weeks trying to maintain her dignity. Despite directing the posh bit, she has been forced into the role of Kathy and been included in dance routines! Carol works for Shakespeare 4 Kidz.

MARY HOLTON has been a Mitre Player forever, and her years of stage training and skill have served her well for her appearances as Bianca and the dead Saskia. She is particularly looking forward to the sex scene with Graham Read, but that's another story.

FRASER MACDONALD is a strange choice to play an expert in the English Language, being the foreigner that he is. He chose to spend Easter with us rather than go diving this year – a decision he probably now regrets, Fraser teaches at good old Trinity School.

COLIN MARSHALL is usually to be found in the Sound Department, though he has trodden the boards frequently in the past. A Mitre since 1993, here he is in drag once more. Colin runs his own Sound Company and actually turned work down for this!

CELINE MURPHY is mother to Ciara (see above) and is a founder member from 1973. In the earlier years, she was our main 'actress'. These days, her occasional appearances see her tackling meaty roles such as tonight's Mary Poppins.

DAVE PRICE has worked so hard on this production that all his hair has dropped out! Dave, who is playing both Mitchell brothers tonight, enjoys the spontaneity of live theatre – in other words, anything could happen.... He works as an interactive exhibit designer.

PAT PRICE is usually to be found in our orchestra – he first played trumpet for us in 1990 for Quasimodo – but tonight he makes a rare appearance (with his trumpet) on-stage wearing a dress. Pat works as a graphic designer.

GRAHAM READ joined in 1987 when he was young and fresh-faced. Now old and fresh-faced, Graham is relishing bodily contact with Mary – tongues will wag! Currently a primary school teacher in Woldingham, Graham is soon to leave us for foreign shores.

PAUL SMITH was a bright slim young thing when he and his brother Alistair became Mitre Players in 1984's "The Boyfriend". So what went wrong? ... These days, Paul acts and directs for several Companies and works for Marie Curie.

MARGARET STOCKWELL seems to have rather taken to the role of Pauline - living with her Pete has probably helped her characterisation! Having joined in 1982, Margaret has more recently graduated to principal roles She works for PSA, with her Pete.

LORRAINE TITCHENER joined the Mitre Players in 1997 She specializes in playing posh parts but is lowering herself this week. Let's see if we can spot the difference between her Melanie and her Cindy. Lorraine is training to be a primary school teacher.

BENJAMIN WARNOCK first appeared for the Mitre Players in 1997's Ready Steady Goose and was then a dwarf last Christmas. He is 9, attends Ridgeway School and also learns piano and dancing. He has a talented father and a beautiful mother...

COLIN WARNOCK is a founder member of the Mitre Players and has been involved in most guises ever since. He is pleased to have collaborated with Messrs. Lerner and Loewe on this production. Colin is a professional musician.

STEPHEN WILLMINGTON is 10 years old and attends Ridgeway Primary School. He appeared as a dwarf in The Millennium Dame and has now got the acting bug! Stephen is the oldest of tonight's children, which is ant as Ian Beale's oldest child is called Steven!
