



A NOTE ABOUT THE SHOW

Based on George S. Kaufman and Moss Hart's 1934 play of the same name, *Merrily We Roll Along* follows the successful career of Broadway composer-turned-Hollywood producer Franklin Shepard backward in time. Throughout the course of the show, during which time regresses from 1976 to 1957, we learn how Frank accomplished this – with the help of his best friends Charley (who writes the books and lyrics) and Mary (who is a writer in her own right and is always around for support and guidance).

The trio of friends are inspired to become big players in American musical theatre and book writing and to "change the world" after witnessing the Russian Sputnik, the first artificial satellite, orbiting the earth on a cold October night. However, over time, Franklin learns what the cost of fame and fortune is, losing and alienating his beloved friends and family along the way and giving up his original dreams for ones with more financial and fewer emotional benefits. Those who began the journey with him do not end up at the end of it with him, and though Franklin has fame, fortune, and success, he ultimately realizes that he has left himself with nothing of any value.

We love it, we love it all!




KEVIN GAUNTLETT DIRECTOR

STEPHEN SONDHEIM MUSIC AND LYRICS

Stephen Joshua Sondheim was born on 22nd March 1930 in New York City, and died on 26th November 2021 at the age of 91.

Sondheim's parents worked in the fashion industry: his father was a dress manufacturer and his mother was a designer. Sondheim showed early musical aptitude, playing piano at a young age, but his parents were not

always supportive of his ability. Sondheim's parents divorced when he was 10 and he moved with his mother to Bucks County near Doylestown, Pennsylvania.

Sondheim soon developed a close relationship with Oscar Hammerstein II, the renowned Broadway lyricist and producer best known for his shows with Richard Rodgers. Sondheim and Hammerstein's son, Jamie, were acquainted, and Hammerstein became Sondheim's surrogate father for all intents and purposes, providing him the musical and creative encouragement that would lead to his later success.

Sondheim made his first significant mark on Broadway as the lyricist for *West Side Story* (1957). He was initially reluctant to join Leonard Bernstein (composer), Jerome Robbins (director/choreographer) and Arthur Laurents (playwright) as lyricist, since he wanted to be a Broadway composer. However, Hammerstein convinced him that the experience of working with three legends of the Broadway stage to create a contemporary *Romeo and Juliet* would be invaluable — and it was. Next, Sondheim grudgingly agreed to a second lyric-writing assignment on *Gypsy* with composer Jule Styne, writing lyrics for Ethel Merman's iconic stage-mother character Rose. The show was a hit and received eight Tony Award nominations.

In 1962, Sondheim finally achieved his goal of writing both music and lyrics for a show with *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum*, an hilarious, bawdy and more-or-less timeless farce based on comedies by the Roman playwright Plautus. The show ran for 964 performances and won the Tony for Best Musical. Sondheim won his first Tony for Best Original Score in 1965 with *Do I Hear A Waltz?*, going on to win this award again in 1971, 1972, 1973, 1979, 1988 and 1994, before being honoured with the 2008 Lifetime Achievement Award. Sondheim's other awards include a Pulitzer Prize (1985), eight Grammy Awards, fifteen Drama Desk Awards, five Olivier Awards and the US Presidential Medal of Freedom.

THE SONDHEIM SOCIETY

The Stephen Sondheim Society, founded in 1993 to promote the public knowledge and appreciation of the works of Stephen Sondheim, produces a magazine, arranges trips to Sondheim shows and organises workshops, masterclasses and study days as well as hosting social events and a unique archive of material. ORIGINAL PLAY

The story of a young playwright who loses as much as he gains as his career advances, Moss Hart and George S. Kaufman's Merrily We Roll Along was "superbly staged...superbly acted" and ran for 155 Performances

MOTION PICTURE VERSION

Starting in 2019, Richard Linklater plans to film Ben Platt, Beanie Feldstein and Paul Mescal as Charley, Mary and Frank over the course of 20 years to allow a natural deageing effect when cut in reverse.

MITRE PLAYERS

First production of Merrily We Roll Along by the Mitre Players. Performed as part of their 25th Anniversary year, it starred Colin Warnock as Charley and Megan Brown as Frank Jr.

MENIER CHOCOLATE FACTOR

This directorial debut of Maria Friedman was lauded by Sondheim as "the best [he'd] seen" and was a critical and commercial success. It transferred to the Harold Pinter Theatre, receiving more five-star reviews than any other musical in West End history.

ORIGINAL BROADWAY PRODUCTION

Directed by Harold Prince, this production faced harsh judgement, describing the libretto as "empty" compared to the score. It was so confusing that the cast had to wear nametags and only managed 16 performances!

LA JOILLA PLAYHOUSE

Directed by James Lapine, this production made it to 24 performances! Still considered "lumbering", Sylvie Drake of the LA Times clearly saw something in it when she wrote "one must hope that the work can and will continue"

DONMAR WAREHOUSE

Directed by Michael Grandage and featuring Daniel Evans, Samantha Spiro and Julian Ovenden, this production received the Olivier Award for Best Musical that year, as well as performance awards for both Evans (Charley) and Spiro (Mary)
