


scenery, lighting, painting, making costumes, making props, doing 'Front of House' or simply would like to make tea for the team, we would still like to hear from you.

which we hope you enjoy tonight. Up against such shows as *Miss Saigon* and *The Baker's Wife* it scooped the 1990 Oliver award for Best Musical. It's success as one of the first ever "Jukebox Musicals" paved the way for many other shows that feature some of rock and roll's greatest hits

After we finish our run in Croydon we shall be on our way to the mighty Minack Theatre in Porthcurno, Cornwall, where we are regular visitors. The Minack, for those who have never been there, is unique; a world famous theatre carved out of the living rock of a Cornish cliff. It is a fantastic venue, and the Mitre Players treasure our relationship with the Theatre and the Management. Long may it continue!



## The Plot Unfolds ......

On a stormy night way back in the winter of 2009, mad scientist Doctor Prospero worked late in his laboratory, aided only by his wife Gloria, as he developed the elusive formula with which he would change the world. However, the apparently faithful Gloria duped him and sent him off into hyper-space in an old spacecraft. Unknown to Gloria, her infant daughter, Miranda, slumbered peacefully in the craft and, together with her father, was catapulted light years into the future.

Fifteen years later, a routine survey flight under the command of the chisel-jawed Captain Tempest leaves earth's orbit with a new Science Officer aboard - a hard and bitter woman. As a shower of meteorites hits the ship, the Science Officer flees, and the craft is pulled inexorably towards the planet D'Illyria - the Forbidden Planet. The adventure begins ......

Act 1: The Crew, headed by Captain Tempest and Bosun Arras, are joined by a new Science Officer. To Tempest's discomfort it is a woman. The spacecraft is caught in a violent asteroid storm which damages the ship. Unsure of what to do Tempest sends for the Science Officer. Bosun reveals she has taken the last shuttlecraft and abandoned ship. There is a crash and the ship lands on an unfamiliar planet.

The Navigational Officer identifies it as D'illyria, but it is not marked on the charts. A face appears on the scanner screen, which Captain Tempest recognises as Prospero, a great scientist who fifteen years ago defected to the other side. Prosperc rejects this, saying he was the victim of a dreadful plot. Just as his great invention was nearing fruition his beloved wife and partner Gloria betrayed him. She bundled him into a rotten satellite and sent him into space with little chance of survival. Unknown to her, their baby daughter was asleep on board. Touched by his tale Tempest welcomes him to feast with him on the ship. A disgruntled Cookie is not impressed as this means more work for him.

The air-lock opens and Prospero enters

followed by a robot called Ariel. A beautiful teenage girl follows them. Prospero introduces her as his daughter, Miranda. She has seen no other humans except her father and is immediately struck by Tempest's looks, and falls in love with him at first sight. Cookie too is love struck, and asks Bosun how he can win Miranda's love.

Ariel reports that the Science Officer is on her way to the ship. He also confides in Tempest and Bosun the secret of Prospero's great invention. Telegenesis, he explains, is a scientific process that can create matter simply by thought. This was the result of the drug, X Factor, which Prospero developed in his laboratory and tried himself.

Prospero is reluctant for Ariel to reveal his secrets, and dismayed at Miranda's feelings for Tempest, he tells her she must choose between them. Puzzled at her father's reaction she entreats him to look kindly on the Captain but says if she has to make a choice it will be Tempest. Seething with anger Prospero leaves. Tempest, though deeply attracted to Miranda, is fighting his emotions. When she declares her love for him he tells her that she is too young.

Cookie is beside himself with pain and jealousy. He is desperate to win the love Tempest has spurned. Prospero does not know how to control his anger and as images take shape in his mind, he takes a test tube marked X Factor and drinks from it He collapses.

A beep appears upon the screen. It is the Science Officer. Another beep is heard, a dreadful monster comes into view - a monster of the mind, but tangible, created from Prospero's drugged brain. The air-lock opens to admit Gloria pursued by the monster.

...................

Act 2: The fight continues and Gloria is rescued by Ariel who blows fire at the monster which explodes and vanishes. The Science Officer is brought face to face with Prospero, her husband. He confronts her with the enormity of her crime and the destruction of a force which could have rid mankind of conflict, famine and disease. Tempest orders her to be relieved from duty. All are distracted by the Navigational Officer's report of damage to the craft sustained in the attack. Gloria is left in the custody of Cookie.

Seeing a chance to change her fortunes she promises Cookie that she will show him how to win her daughter's love. He must obtain the secret X Factor formula.

Prospero comes up with the solution to the damaged spacecraft. The crew and passengers undergo reverse polarity procedure. Gloria alone, is tortured by the complexity of her feelings for Prospero, the man she loves but has pledged to destroy.

Ariel enters having repaired the damage to the ship. As he talks to Tempest a sexy vamp appears, To Tempest's horror it is Miranda. Advising her to buy a jar of cleansing cream he exits. Heartbroken, Miranda confesses to Ariel that she had thought that as she could not attract the captain with her youthful charms she should try a more obvious approach. As Ariel consoles her, Miranda says what she really needs is a Robot man. As Cookie enters with the stolen X Factor. he is aghast to see Miranda now kissing Ariel and attacks him. At the end of the fight Ariel has the formula which he eats. The bleeper goes, the monster is heard returning. Gloria enters and confronts Prospero. She tells him he is a man of sin whose force for good has become a force for evil as Prospero's genius brain has created an uncontrollable monster from the old man's own subconscious mind

Forced to recognise the truth of her statement, Prospero, in a heroic gesture of love and sacrifice, goes off to commit galactic suicide.

As the crew prepares for take off, Miranda is comforted by Tempest who declares his love for her. As the craft takes off there is a tremendous rumble as the planet below them begins to disintegrate. Ariel explains that just as Prospero could create monsters he could also create great beauty as in D'illyria. With his suicide the planet created from his imagination must also cease to be.



## Rockin<sup>'</sup> into Space

#### THE ANIMALS

Formed from the ashes of the Alan Price combo in 1963, legend has it that The Animals were given their name by their fans due to their wild stage act. In 1964 they toured the UK with Chuck Berry and the Swinging Blue Jeans. Later that year *House Of The Rising Sun* topped the UK charts despite its length [6 minutes!]. Subsequent hits included *Don't Let Me Be Misunderstood* [1965]. *We've Got To Get Out Of This Place* and *I'm Gonna Change The World*. The original lineup had brief comebacks in 1975 and 1983. There have been several partial regroupings of the original era members since then under various names. The Animals were inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1994.

#### THE BEACH BOYS

Featuring the Wilson Brothers, Brian, Dennis and Carl and two friends, they had many hits in the early sixties, including *Wouldn't It Be Nice, Sloop John B* and *God Only Knows*. The 1966 album *Pet Sounds* took over six months to record and features the classic *Good Vibrations* It reached number 1 on both sides of the Atlantic and as a result they replaced The Beatles as 'The World's Best Group' in that year's NME poll. In June 2012, Mike Love confirmed the Beach Boys would be playing some dates in South America in October 2012 although the lineup would feature only himself and Bruce Johnston and include a different backing band than the current one.

#### JAMES BROWN

I a career that spanned six decades, Brown profoundly influenced the development of many different musical genres. Although he contributed much to the music world through his hitmaking, Brown holds the record as the artist who charted the most singles on the Billboard Hot 100 without ever hitting number one on that chart. It's a Man's Man's Man's World was recorded on February 16, 1966 in a New York studio and released as a single later that year. It reached number 1 on the Billboard Top R&B Singles charts. The song became a staple of Brown's live shows. At the time of Brown's death, his band included three guitarists, two bass guitar players, two drummers, three horns and a percussionist. In 1986, he was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and in 1990 into the Songwriters Hall of Fame. Brown died on Christmas Day 2006 from heart failure.

#### THE BYRDS

Formed in 1964 as The Jet Set, they soon changed their name to The Beefeaters and then The Byrds. Their first album, *Mr Tambourine Man*, was produced by Doris Day's son, Terry Melcher, and featured four songs by Bob Dylan. The title song topped the charts on both sides of the Atlantic. *Mr Spaceman* was featured on their 1965 album, *Fifth Dimension*, and although regarded by many as a classic pop song, it only reached number 36 in the US Charts. To date, a tribute concert appearance in 2000 represents the last time that The Byrds have performed together. However, Hillman and Crosby have both expressed an interest in working with McGuinn again on future Byrds projects, but the lead guitarist and head Byrd remains adamant that he is not interested in another reunion.

#### **DION AND THE BELMONTS**

Founded in 1957 by Dion DiMucci and a group of boys from the Bronx, they got their name from Belmont Avenue, a well-known local hang-out. In 1959, *Teenager in Love* only reached number 28 in the UK because both Marty Wilde and Craig Douglas had covered it first. In 1962, *The Wanderer* was a hit on both sides of the Atlantic and it was Dion's last UK hit until it was re-released in 1976. In 2000, Dion and the Belmonts were inducted in the Vocal Group Hall of Fame.

#### **GEORGIE FAME**

Fame was born in 1943 and took piano lessons from the age of seven. After taking part in a singing contest at a Butlins Holiday Camp he was offered a job there by the band leader, early British rock'n'roll star Rory Blackwell. When his manager Ronan O'Rahilly, couldn't get Fame's first record played by the BBC or Radio Luxembourg, he announced he would start his own radio station in order to promote the record. The station became pirate, Radio Caroline. Later Fame enjoyed regular chart success with singles, having three Top 10 hits, which all made number one in the UK Singles Chart. His version of Yeh Yeh, released on 14 January 1965, spent two weeks at number 1. He is still a popular performer, often working with contemporaries such as Van Morrison and Bill Wyman.

#### **FLEETWOOD MAC**

Formed in 1967 in London they are a British-American rock band and the only original member still present in the band is its eponymous drummer, Mick Fleetwood. The two most successful periods for the band were during the late 1960s British blues boom, when they were led by guitarist Peter Green and achieved a UK number one with *Albatross*, and from 1975 to 1987, with more pop-orientation, featuring Christine McVie, Lindsey Buckingham and Stevie Nicks.. 1977's *Rumours*, produced four U.S. Top 10 singles (including Nicks' song *Dreams*, which was the band's first and only U.S. number 1) and remained at number 1 on the American albums chart for 31 weeks.

#### **CONNIE FRANCIS**

A child prodigy, born in 1938, Connie's first nine singles failed to make the charts, but as she was about to start at University, she recorded *Who's Sorry Now* which featured on the first ever Dick Clark's American Bandstand. *Robot Man* reached number 2 in the UK in 1960. Various hits followed and she continued recording into the 1990s. In 1972 she sang for the US President, Lyndon Johnson. She continues to appear live to this day.

#### **BILL HALEY AND HIS COMETS**

He began his career as a professional musician in 1942 straight from school. However, it was not until 1953 that he had his first hit, *Crazy Man Crazy*. This was the first Rock & Roll disc to enter the Billboard pop charts. This coincided with him changing the name of his group to Bill Haley and his Comets. A subsequent move to Decca Records in 1954 continued his rise to fame. The B-side of his first single for them was *Rock Around the Clock* and his second single *Shake, Rattle and Roll*. Although several members of the Comets became famous, Bill Haley remained the star with his spit curl and the band's matching plaid dinner jackets and energetic stage behaviour. He died in his sleep of an apparent heart attack on February 9, 1981.

#### **JERRY LEE-LEWIS**

Almost as famous for his scandalous private life as his songs, his second single *Great Balls of Fire* never reached number 1 in the US; it was kept off the top by Danny and the Juniors' *At the Hop.* It did however reach number 1 in the UK. In 1988 Dennis Quaid played Lewis in the drama/documentary feature film, *Great Ball of Fire.* On October 29, 2009, Lewis opened the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame 25th Anniversary concert at Madison Square Garden in New York.

#### THE MOODY BLUES

Originally called The MB Five, they started playing at The Carlton Ballroom, Birmingham in 1964. In 1965, their second single *Go Now* reached number 1 on both sides of the Atlantic. Later that year, they supported The Beatles on their last UK tour. This success was not repeated until 1968 when their classically inspired *Nights in White Satin* reached the charts featuring The London Festival Orchestra. The new millennium saw the Moody Blues reducing their touring schedule. At the end of 2002, founding member Ray Thomas retired from the group, reducing the Moody Blues to the trio of Hayward, Lodge, and Edge, the latter being the only original member remaining.

#### **BOBBY "Boris" PICKETT**

He was an American singer born in 1938. He was known for co-writing and performing the 1962 hit novelty song, \*\*Manufer\*\* \*\*Wash\*\* - a spoof on the dance crazes popular at the time, including the \*\*Twist\*\* and the \*\*Mashed \*\*Potato\*\*, which inspired the title. The song featured Pickett's impersonations of veteran horror stars Boris Karloff and Bela Lugosi. The single became a million seller, reaching number 1 on the Billboard Hot 100 chart for two weeks before Halloween in 1962. It was styled as being by Bobby 'Boris' Pickett & the Crypt-Kickers. In Britain it took until October 1973 for the tune to become popular, peaking at number 3 in the UK Singles Chart. In 1975 Pickett recorded a novelty spoof on \*\*Star Trek\*\* called \*\*Star Drek\*\* with Peter Ferrara. He also performed a duet with Ferrara in 1976 titled \*\*King \*\*Kong (Your Song)\*\* spoofing the movie by the same name that was released that year. Pickett died at the age of 69 on April 25, 2007.

#### **GARY PUCKETT & THE UNION GAP**

Initially credited as **The Union Gap featuring Gary Puckett**, they were an American pop rock group operating in the late 1960s. Their biggest hits were *Woman, Woman, Young Girl*, and *Lady Willpower: Young Girl* reached number 1 in the UK singles chart, and number 6 when it was reissued in the UK six years later. Controversial at the time and later for its risqué lyrical references to underage romance, Allmusic labelled the group's lyrics 'bizarrely paedophilic'. It was the second million selling disc for the band. After the Union Gap was disbanded, Puckett had modest success as a solo artist, mostly performing and re-recording the band's songs. By 1973 he had essentially disappeared from music, opting instead to study acting and dance and performing in theatrical productions in and around Los Angeles. A comeback tour brought him to Las Vegas in 1981, and from that point on he has been a regular on the national oldies circuit<sup>[1]</sup>

#### **ROY ORBISON**

Born in 1936, Roy started his career in 1954 representing Texas at The International Lions Club Convention in Chicago. Despite many recording contracts and releases, he had to wait until 1960 when *Only the Lonely* reached number 2 in the US charts. Originally offered to Elvis Presley and the Everly Brothers, it topped the UK charts later that year. Orbison re-launched his career in 1988 with the Travelling Wilburys, featuring George Harrison, Jeff Lynne, Tom Petty and Bob Dylan. This was short-lived as he died later that year from a heart attack.

#### **CLIFF RICHARD**

Born Harry Webb in India in 1940, Cliff's debut single was in 1958. In competition with Elvis's *Blue Hawaii*, his film *The Young Ones* was the second biggest box office hit of 1962. Never out of the limelight, Cliff has continued recording till the present day and EMI will be releasing his latest album, *Soulicious*, in October 2012.

#### SPENCER DAVIS GROUP

They were a mid-1960s British beat group from Birmingham, formed by Spencer Davis with Steve Winwood and his brother Muff who came up with the band's name, reasoning "Spencer was the only one who enjoyed doing interviews, so I pointed out that if we called it the Spencer Davis Group, the rest of us could stay in bed and let him do them." Their best known songs include *Somebody Help Me*, and the UK number one *Keep on Running*. By the end of 1966 and the beginning of 1967, the group released two more hits, *Gimme Some Lovin'* and *I'm a Man*. Both of them sold over one million copies, and were awarded gold record status. These tracks proved to be their two best-known successes, especially in the U.S. Steve Winwood left in 1967, to form *Traffic* before joining *Blind Faith* arguably the world's first "supergroup", then forging a career as a soloist. After releasing a few more singles the band ceased activity in 1968. Davis started a new group in 2006. As of 2010, The Spencer Davis Group still extensively tours the USA and Europe, but with two differing line-ups, only Spencer Davis himself is present in both formations of the band.

#### **STEPPENWOLF**

Steppenwolf are a Canadian-American rock group formed in 1967 in Los Angeles by vocalist John Kay, guitarist Michael Monarch, bassist Rushton Moreve, keyboardist Goldy McJohn and drummer Jerry Edmonton. The band has sold more than 25 million records worldwide, releasing eight gold albums and twelve Billboard Hot 100 singles of which six were Top 40 hits, including three Top 10 successes: **Born to Be Wild. Magic Carpet Ride**, and **Rock Me**. Steppenwolf enjoyed worldwide success from 1968 to 1974, but clashing personalities led to the end of the core line-up. Today, frontman John Kay is the only original member left, having served as lead singer for more than 40 years.

#### THE TORNADOS

The Tornados were formed in 1962 from session musicians by the legendary producer Joe Meek to back Billy Fury. Their first single *Love and Fury* flopped but their second, *Teleter* (which was inspired by the recently launched communication satellite), topped the UK charts for five weeks and the US charts for three weeks. In 1965 they wrote the theme tune for Gerry Anderson's TV series *Stingray*.

#### THEM

Featuring vocalist Van Morrison, Them were one of the first R&B/Beat groups in Northern Ireland, a country then dominated by 'Showbands'. Two 1965 singles, *Baby Please Don't Go* and *Here Comes The Night* reached the UK chart. However the B-side of the former, *Gloria*, penned by Van Morrison became one of the most influential songs of the sixties.

#### THE ZOMBIES

The Zombies were formed in 1963 by Rod Argent and Colin Blunstone [amongst others] whilst still at school. Having left with over 50 'O' and 'A' Levels between them, their first single *She's Not There* reached number 12 in the UK charts and later on, number 2 in the US. Despite an international union agreement, they were initially banned from touring the US because of fears of a British invasion. The band tour the USA and Canada every year now, as they also do in The Netherlands and the UK.

For 29 years, Colin has worked at the prestigious Laine Theatre Arts in Epsom, helping to train the stars of tomorrow.










Paul Adams (Set Designer): Paul has designed sets for various theatres and was a professional scenic artist for Thames TV for 25 years as well as working with the BBC before becoming a freelance scenic artist in the Middle East, Germany and Italy (to name but a few). He has also painted murals at the Greenwich Naval Museum and the London Museum. As a performing artist he has sung leading roles in many shows including Sweeney Todd, Man of La Mancha and Kiss Me Kate.


Alan Bishop (Lighting Designer): Alan has enjoyed lighting all the Mitre's shows at The Minack, especially the sun-drenched matinees. 'Planet' is one of his favourite shows, having seen the original show in London. With much of the music coming from "his era", sometimes he can even be seen tapping his toes to the tunes [not necessarily in time]. Along with Alan Cs' wish for a show with two chairs and a table. Alan B often dreams of a play with 2 lights and 2 cues, but wakes up at the Minack and soon realises that would be just too easy!



Alan Collins (Stage Manager): This is the eighth time that Alan has been involved in building a set at the foot of the Minack cliff. Each time he hopes that, like other companies, the designer will come up with a set that consists of two chairs and a table. but if they did it wouldn't be Mitre. To date there has been - Notre Dame cathedral for *Quasimodo*, a Jacobean house for the *Country Wife*, followed by a duck pond for Honk! heaven knows where for the Hunting of the Snark, Just So was set on the grey, green, greasy Limpopo river, Gulliver travelled to Lilliput and Laputa amongst other places, then there was a Cape Cod whaler for Moby Dick. Now perhaps the most difficult task is to reconstruct the USS Albatross where it has crash-landed on the Forbidden Planet. He still thinks that it's one of the great venues and a privilege to work here.

Di Jones (Wardrobe Mistress): This is Di's third trip to the Minack as wardrobe mistress and this time she and her team have made the costumes, so she's praying for good weather! She came out of retirement to act in *Gulliver's Travels*, but loves working backstage and directing. She directed *Is There Life After High School?* for Mitre Players in February and is looking forward to directing *Calendar Girls* in October.

Charles Marriott (Special Video Sequences): The job title sounds like something from a Hollywood movie. Regrettably, Charles did not create the sequences in the "hub" of the film world, but Sanderstead in Croydon....the home of The Mitre Players! Applying his long standing film experience is not a totally "out of this world" thing for him.....it is what he does for a "day job". Apart from directing film and television projects, Charles is occasionally unleashed in a stage environment and has most recently directed the Alistair McGowan comedy *Timing*, and has also applied his experience and training as a professional actor to the character Mr. Pressman in *Our House*, both Mitre Players productions



Andy Thompson (Special Effects): A founder member of the Mitre Players in 1973, Andy has been involved in countless Mitre shows. Originally taking part on stage, Andy has spent the majority of the last 40 years backstage, often doing special effects, which he did professionally for 30 years. He was Chairman of the society for 11 years. Andy Roid is his latest project and is the first large robot he has built since Metal Mickey, many years ago! Recent Minack creations include a one foot high animatronic dancing Gulliver for Gulliver's Travels and dancing water fountains for *Moby Dick*.


