

John Longenbaugh, author

John grew up in Alaska. After high school he attended the University of Kent in Canterbury as an undergraduate and then the University of York as a graduate, and (after a brief hiatus) the Central School of Speech and Drama on their directing course. He then went to Seattle and within six months was



writing theatre criticism for the Seattle Weekly, where he was soon promoted from freelancer to full-time theatre critic. He worked at the Weekly for six years, while continuing to write and direct theatre at the rate of one or two shows a year. He eventually quit the job at the Weekly, gratified to have come away with some great memories, a couple of regional journalism awards, and some good friends.

From late 2003 to early 2005 he was the artistic director of a small fringe company, Theatre Babylon, which managed to produce a year and a half of great plays before losing their venue to an impressive mass of bureaucratic red tape.

From 2008 to 2010 he was the PR Manager for Seattle's 5th Avenue Theatre which produced a full season of fully-staged musicals. Since then he has focused more on writing while continuing to try and keep his various theatre projects spinning. There's a novel, and there are short stories, and there are even screenplays these days, as he begins a flirtation with the strange new worlds of independent films.



Mary Holton (Violet Holmes)

Over 25 years ago Mary appeared in a pink ballet dress in *Dame Sherlock*. She has also appeared as a ghost in two panto chases. Luckily this ghostly appearance is much more sedate and she really wanted to be in a production about one of her heroes.



Warwick Jones (Sherlock Holmes)

Warwick is delighted to be performing

again at the Clubhouse where he first began with the Mitres 40 years ago. Since then he is sure he has been in one artistic triumph after another.....he just can't remember any. As John Lennon wrote, and Sherlock might have said, 'So this is Christmas'.



Jane Kortlandt (Mrs Hudson, Eli, Wiggins/German Soldier)

Jane's last show with the Mitres was *Spamalot* at the Minack, so playing Mrs. Hudson is a nice change from playing a peasant - at least there is no hessian in this one. Jane's most memorable Christmas was performing in Panto many years ago as the Voice of Queen Zog, from behind a screen, operating a shadow puppet. The leading lady lost her voice so Jane

stepped in to sing off stage on her behalf - and sang the wrong words. She is sure no-one noticed! Other Mitre credits include Cora in *Calendar Girls, Return To The Forbidden Planet* and Kath in *Our House*.

Simon Long (Young Holmes, Spirit 2, Albert)

As a big fan of Sherlock in all his genres, Simon is excited to be playing the great detective as a young man and offering clues to his enigmatic character. Simon has been with the Mitre

Players for some years now and appeared in too many productions to mention – those who have seen him before will hopefully remember past performances! Even now, as a 22 year old, he absolutely LOVES Christmas, and has already started playing and singing along to Christmas songs in his car! Ros Broyd (Spirit 1, Toff's girl, Head Nurse)
