

I was involved with the Mitre Players' first production of Something's Afoot in 1989 - when I assisted Colin Warnock who was directing and also did the choreography. It was a great success so I am really surprised that I have never heard of another production of it anywhere else, and was obviously delighted to revisit it again when asked to direct it for this summer's tour. I don't know why it is not performed by more societies - perhaps it is the elaborate set & ingenious death scenes that puts them off, but you know the Mitre Players - we love a challenge and creating a stately home in the Old Boys clubhouse and then moving the whole lot down to Devon and recreating it at the Shaftesbury Theatre, Dawlish is all in a (long) days work for this talented (crazv) bunch.

Something's Afoot is never going to go down in history as a "classic piece of theatre", but we hope you will agree it is very funny and has some great toe tapping numbers. It is perfect for our summer tour and we trust will provide you, the audience, with a memorable evening. The cast have had enormous fun bringing the wonderful characters to life and those behind the scenes have certainly risen to the challenge too!

I am hugely grateful to the construction crew - especially Alan Collins, Alan Bishop & Colin Parrish who have given up several weekends to build this fabulous set to ensure Wiggy's marvellous design becomes a reality. We are so lucky to have such a great backstage team in all the departments - props, sound, lighting, costumes, special effects, box office, front of house and set construction & design - we really couldn't do it without you guys so THANKS!

This is definitely the easiest time I have ever had directing, because with a cast this good, all I had to do was point them in the right direction, wait for them to learn the lines and leave them to it. They have all been a real pleasure to work with and have made my job not only hugely enjoyable (I've never laughed so much at rehearsals) but also really very stress free (and it is not often you will hear a director saying that!)

Helen Harman has been a huge asset to the society with her imaginative choreography - we tend to work very much in the same way and often came up with the same ideas, so it is a delight to have her on the team. My job was made easier still by having my Mum, Gillian as my "right hand man". writing everything down and making sure we didn't forget anything, as well as prompting (although I hope we will have little use of these skills during the performances!) And of course with Colin taking care of the Musical Direction, assisted by James Beal and the wonderful band we couldn't really go wrong.

To put together a touring show which is also designed to be a holiday, involves a lot of hard work so my thanks go to those who have made it happen once again. I'm sure we will all have a marvellous time in Dawlish and I am grateful to everyone who has contributed in some way. What a team!

So, all in all, this has been an extremely happy production to be involved with and my wish is that our enjoyment will be conveyed to you in the audience, and that you too will have as much fun watching, as we have had rehearsing and performing. Thanks for coming tonight - and if you enjoy it, tell all your friends!

NAME: Nigel Rancour ALIAS: Ian Brown


MODUS OPERANDI: Appears to be an upper class twit; but don't be deceived, behind that mask is a cold ruthless heart!

BACKGROUND: Last seen for The Mitres disguised as an egg and a teddy bear in *Robinson Crusoe*. A former pupil of Trinity School, Croydon, Ian has been in countless productions including; *The Boyfriend, Mr Cinders* and *Nicholas Nickleby* and has directed, *Romeo and Juliet, Guys and Dolls* and will be in charge of our production of *Oliver* next Spring.

CURRENT ACTIVITY: Runs a branch of the Helen O'Grady

Drama Academy for children, passing on all his many, many years of experience.



NAME: Geoffrey. ALIAS: Mark Goody

MODUS OPERANDI: Gives the impression of having no idea how to dance – a complete ruse in order not to show anyone else up!

WEAPON OF CHOICE: Probably a trailing leg while he is dancing – watch out for being tripped up!

BACKGROUND: Recently hidden himself away from view with the Mitres by stage managing Robinson Crusoe and Abigail's Party, he debuted in The Madness of George III in a fetching wig, pulling curtains. He has also been on stage elsewhere, notably as Simon in Jesus Christ Superstar.

CURRENT ACTIVITY: Often to be seen masquerading as a retail consultant, which he claims is his 'job'!


NAME: Hope Langdon ALIAS: Emily Grogan

BACKGROUND: Though only 19 years old and the youngest cast member by far, Emily has now clocked up four Mitre shows including this: *Guys and Dolls*, *Little Shop of Horrors* and *Return to the Forbidden Planet*, which saw her debut at Dawlish. Soon to be seen as Eliza Doolittle in *My Fair Lady* at Croydon's Ashcroft Theatre.

CURRENT ACTIVITY: Might be seen or heard studying for her ABRSM singing diploma.

WEAPON OF CHOICE: You never know what might be in her delicious lemon cake!

BACKGROUND: A choreographer for over 30 years, Helen has been involved in numerous shows in that time, mounting productions in Crawley, Bromley, Croydon and Epsom, to name but a few venues. Her exploits have taken her to foreign climes including involvement in a production of *Oklahoma* in Hungary!

CURRENT ACTIVITY: When not kicking those legs, you may spy Helen gardening or indulging in the mysteries of yoga.



NAME: Colonel Gillweather ALIAS: Dave Price

MODUS OPERANDI: Loves to dress up! Especially in military uniform of any sort, witnessed by his background activities!

WEAPON OF CHOICE: Usually a pistol, rifle, sword, dagger – anything deadly really!

BACKGROUND: Another former Trinity School pupil, he hates people to know what he has done in the past, but as referred to above, his obsession with uniforms has come into play several times including; *The Long the Short and the Tall* (which he also directed), *The Madness of George III* and various Pirates in Panto! Married to Lettie, he is still amazed how he managed to attract her – must be something to do with his weapons!

CURRENT ACTIVITY: Usually dashing about here and there – and has made several visits this year to the Middle East!!!

NAME: Lettie ALIAS: Lorraine Price

MODUS OPERANDI: Has a very dirty laugh which somehow lets you think there is more to her than meets the eye!! There is!

WEAPON OF CHOICE: What she can do with a feather duster is nobody's business!

BACKGROUND: Has been seen on various stages throughout Croydon over the years. Mitre appearances include *Merrily We Roll Along, The Madness of George III* and various Pantos, Lorraine made her directorial debut earlier this year with her production of *Abigail's Party*. She is married to Colonel Gillweather.

CURRENT ACTIVITY: Works in the guise of a teacher and can also be seen running the streets of Croydon and London, a veteran of two marathons.



NAME Miss Tweed ALIAS: Morven Rae

MODUS OPERANDI: Few people are deceived by the real life Scots accent – most people know that there is a South Croydon drawl aching to escape!

WEAPON OF CHOICE: Those muscles, which come in handy for her chosen profession. Would you pick a fight with this character?

BACKGROUND: Previous convictions with The Mitres include *The Hunting of the Snark, The Cherry Orchard* and *Honk*! but she has also been seen with outfits such as CODA and The Miller Centre, Caterham. Morven is a Dawlish virgin – is Dawlish quite ready for her?

CURRENT ACTIVITY: Often to be seen pulling people about on a couch – she is a physiotherapist!

NAME: Flint ALIAS: Paul Smith

MODUS OPERANDI: Don't be fooled by his laughter and lightheartedness – he has a filthy temper when he directs!! It's true!

WEAPON OF CHOICE: Don't get him on the subject of London – he may well use all his wiles to bore you to death! (see below)

BACKGROUND: A Mitre for 21 years he is the only surviving member of the original 1989 cast – though he has aged gracefully, he feels he is only just too old to reprise Geoffrey. Other shows include *The Mikado*, *Little Shop of Horrors* and *Honk!* and has directed *The Cherry Orchard, Nicholas Nickleby* and *The Madness of George III.* Also a tap dancing, marathon running bore!



CURRENT ACTIVITY: Charity worker of some years, he has been writing his London walking guide for some time and looks forward to seeing it in bookshops.

NAME: Clive/Musical Director ALIAS: Colin Warnock

MODUS OPERANDI: So busy all the time – juggles many jobs and activities in the air all at the same time!

WEAPON OF CHOICE: One of several in the cast with a distinctive laugh – too much of it could be lethal!

BACKGROUND: Former pupil of Trinity School and a founder member of The Mitre Players, he played the title role in our first production, *Charley's Aunt*. He has performed in many shows since and has been in charge of the music for countless others, including writing the music for nearly all of our pantos. He loved it all so much that he has been married to the current wardrobe mistress for 25 years this September.

CURRENT ACTIVITY: Works undercover at Laine Theatre Arts college for performing arts, where he has been since 1983.
