

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## CHAIRMAN'S LETTER

I would like to welcome you to the Mitre Players' production of Monty Python's Spamalot. I was part of our first tour to the Minack in 1992, when we performed **The Wizard of Oz.** Since then we have returned every two or three years with challenging shows that are not often performed by others (amateur or professional). These include **Honk!**, **The Hunting of the Snark**, **Just So**, **Moby Dick** as well as our own home-grown musicals, **Quasimodo** and **Gulliver's Travels**.

This time, on our 11th visit, we continue the tradition with **Spamalot**. We are very honoured to be currently the only amateurs performing it in England. We follow the recent Monty Python Reunion by the surviving members of the original comedy group at the O2 that sold out in 40 seconds and, you may recall, Eric Idle's acclaimed performance of Always Look on the Bright Side of Life at the 2012 Olympic Closing Ceremony - the world sang along and Spamalot audiences get the opportunity to do so too!

Some who have seen it in rehearsal have remarked that this is the 'perfect' Mitre show. It has been voted the funniest musical in Britain and is certainly in sync with our light-hearted and sometimes zany, yet professional and dedicated way of doing things.

Although the professional production in London's West End closed several months ago, the show is touring the country next year, but the closest to the Minack you would be able to see it is in Torquay in July!



## DIRECTOR'S NOTES

**Monty Python's Spamalot** is based on the true story of Arthur, King of the Britons, who not only found the Holy Grail but at the same time became the grandfather of musical theatre (this was way, way back ... pre-Stephen Sondheim!).

Obviously in the original story there was loads more killing and bloodshed and a lot less singing and dancing, but this version by the eminent historian Eric Idle and the Master of the Queen's Music John Du Prez has managed to balance historical fact with showbiz pizzazz.

The show was first performed by the Royal Shakespeare Company in rep with *Hamlet* in 1963 and the company memorably made full use of doubling set, costumes and swords. Elsinore castle made a good Camelot and Laurence Olivier famously won a double award for his portrayal of both Hamlet and King Arthur.

(In fact, rather like the coin-toss between Lords Derby and Bunbury over the naming of the Epsom classic horse race, there was some debate as to whether the eponymous Olivier Awards should have been called the Arthur Awards.)

Sadly the transfer to Broadway never happened in the 60s but it did eventually play there in 2005, when it opened at the Shubert Theatre (opposite Sardi's) starring Tim Curry as Arthur and David Hyde Pierce as Sir Robin. This was when I first saw and fell in love with the show and indeed with Sara Ramirez, who played the Lady of the Lake. On its transfer to London's Palace Theatre, I then fell in love with the even more wonderful Hannah Waddingham (who I'm pleased to say has since agreed to set aside the restraining order). The great Shakespearean Simon Russell Beale was also a memorable Arthur, as were more recently Marcus Brigstocke, Joe Pasquale and one half of Dick & Dom.






Some people think that *Spamalot* is merely a frivolous and irreverent spoof on the Arthurian Legend, but these deluded types fail to grasp the significance that the Holy Grail is "within us all", as Sir Robin tells us. The quest to find the Holy Grail is in fact the quest to which we all aspire: to produce a hit Broadway show, and the nods and references to *Fiddler on the Roof, Les Misérables, Phantom of the Opera, Singin' in the Rain, Funny Girl, The Producers, Man of la Mancha* et al are all part of this homage to the Great White Way.

For just as the Holy Grail is a Broadway hit, the most important theme of all is musical theatre - and I'm delighted to be able to bring a little bit of Broadway Arthur to his true home here in Cornwall.






**Eric Idle** (Book, lyrics, and music) He has multi-hyphenated his way through life, from being a writer and actor in the legendary "Monty Python" TV series and films to the creator and director of "The Rutles." He has appeared on stage singing rude songs with John Du Prez at Carnegie Hall and the Hollywood Bowl as well as performing in two highly successful tours, Eric Idle Exploits Monty Python (2000) and The Greedy Bastard Tour (2003), for which they journeyed 15,000 miles across North America in a bus. His Greedy Bastard Diary of that tour is available from Harper Collins. Their latest work, a comic oratorio called Not the Messiah, will be performed shortly in Toronto. His play Pass The Butler ran for five months in London's West End; he has written two novels, Hello Sailor and The Road to Mars, a children's book, The Quite Remarkable Adventures of the Owl and The Pussycat, and a bedside companion, The Rutland Dirty Weekend Book. Spamalot has already won him a Tony, a Grammy and the respect of

his wife and children.

#### John Du Prez (Music)

He is a Trevelyan Scholar at Christ Church, Oxford, and Associate of the Royal College of Music. He entered the film industry in 1978 composing additional music for Monty Python's Life of Brian. This began a long association with Eric Idle, leading eventually to their current writing partnership. He has scored more than 20 feature films including The Meaning of Life, A Private Function, A Fish Called Wanda, Once Bitten, UHF and Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles I, II, and III. Other Python projects include the Contractual Obligation Album, Monty Python at the Hollywood Bowl and The Fairly Incomplete & Rather Badly Illustrated Monty Python Song Book. He was musical director for Eric Idle's two North American stage tours, Eric Idle Exploits Monty Python (2000) and The Greedy Bastard Tour (2003). This show was his Broadway debut.

#### Monty Python

Is he God or Godot, an agent of the devil or an agent of the William Morris Agency, or is he, as some have argued, a fictitious character invented in 1969 by Graham Chapman, John Cleese, Terry Gilliam, Eric Idle, Terry Jones, and Michael Palin in a desperate attempt to find a title for their rather silly TV show? Whatever the truth, he is the eponymous impresario who fronts "The Flying Circus," The Holy Grail, The Life of Brian, The Meaning of Life, And Now for Something Completely Different and who appeared Live at Drury Lane, City Center and the Hollywood Bowl. He has fronted numerous books including The Big Red Book and the Papperbok as well as many CDs, DVDs and matching ties and handkerchiefs. Julian Chenery (Director): Julian aka JC, The Legend or - since his infamous portrayal in *The Hunting of the Snark* here in 2004 – The Broker, has been involved with the Mitre Players since 1984 and first appeared with them here at the Minack as the Tin Man in the 1992 production of *The Wizard of Oz*. He was also in *Man of La Mancha* in 1994 and directed Stiles & Drewe's *Just So* in 2006. He is a professional producer, director, writer and (sometime) actor and is best known for his work as the creative force behind Shakespeare 4 Kidz.

Helen Harman (Choreographer): Helen says it is a privilege to be involved in another Mitre production. Helen has choreographed all the Minack Mitre shows since 2004 and in addition directed our 2012 production of *Return to the Forbidden Planet.* Helen would like to congratulate and thank the *Spamalot* cast and the wooden rabbit for all their hard work and input during rehearsals. Colin has worked at the prestigious Laine Theatre Arts in Epsom for the past 31 years, helping to train the stars of tomorrow.





## MEET THE TEAM





Paul Adams (Historian and Scenic Artist): Paul designed the last Minack production two years ago, Return To The Forbidden Planet. This time he has been promoted to the boards, albeit a "hiccup and a burp". He started singing and acting 50 years ago, but he's 'Not (quite) Dead Yet!!

Sarah Block (Ensemble): Spamalot is Sarah's first show with the Mitre Players and although she originally auditioned for the role of Knight of Ni, being vertically challenged meant this wasn't to be. Always one to look on the bright side of life, Sarah is looking forward to proving she is not yet dead in this Monty Python extravaganza! Sarah enjoys singing and dancing and has previously enjoyed treading the boards in other plays and musicals. She may not succeed on Broadway, but is hoping to find her grail on stage at the Minack.

Alan Bishop (Lighting Designer): Alan has enjoyed lighting all the Mitres' shows at the Minack, especially the sun-drenched matinees. He remembers with affection all of the Python shows from their original TV airings, especially the "Argument" sketch, so if you would like the "full half hour", please let him know. By foolishly agreeing to make the turrets light up, he has now made work for himself as these show up during those previously unlit sun-drenched matinees.















Laura Brand (Laker Girl, Ensemble): Laura is delighted to be making her debut with the Mitre Players, having been a supporter of their shows for some time. She performed at (and consequently fell in love with) the Minack Theatre for the first time in August 2013, where she appeared in the Barnstormers' production of *Parade*, which won the Minack trophy that year. She was so desperate to come back to perform again that she ended up tagging along with the first group who said they were going, which unfortunately for them and her ended up being the Mitre Players! In 'real life', Laura works for Surrey County Council and is currently completing a degree in Social Policy and Criminology with the Open University.

**Ian Brown** (Brother Maynard, Ensemble): Ian has been a Mitre for 32 years and has appeared at the Minack many times, his favourite roles here being Greylag the Goose in **Honk!** in 2002 and the Cooking Stove in **Just So** in 2006. Among other parts, Ian is playing a Frond in this show but would like to point out that he does occasionally play humans too. Being a Mitre Player has influenced Ian's whole life and for the last 20 years he has run the Croydon branch of the Helen O'Grady Drama Academy. As well as appearing on stage, Ian has directed ten shows for the Mitres.

Peter Calver (Sir Robin): This part represents a change for Peter as it is the most manly he has been cast in for some time. Usually to be found in high heels, creative hair dos and enormous breasts, he is altogether butching it up as Sir Robin, complete with dashing tunic, stylish boots and a dinky little chopper. The way he mounts his imaginary goat has also brought tears to many a man's eye, especially his... (note the use of an imaginary goat rather than an imaginary horse due to not being able to afford an imaginary horse). Once again he owes much to his cats who have ably assisted in rehearsals – Ben for helping with line learning, Jerry for sitting on any costumes he could get his paws on and Esmeralda for writing love poems to King Arthur, who she thinks is dishy...

Paul Cohen (Mime Artist, Knight of Ni, Minstrel, Concorde, Ensemble): Paul is a big fan of Monty Python so is really excited to appear in the show in a number of weird and wonderful guises. In recent years Paul has taken on the mantle of choreographer and assistant director, including *The Wedding Singer* and *Boogie Nights* for the Mitre Players. He returned to the stage in April appearing as a sex-obsessed mental patient in *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest*. Paul is pleased to be back on stage in a musical, although he is finding that his fitness levels aren't quite what they used to be! It's also been quite a while since he has had so many costume changes, so he apologises in advance if he appears on stage half naked as this will probably be due to his costume being blown over the cliff as he attempts a quick change!

Alan Collins (Stage Manager): This is the ninth time that Alan has been involved in building a set at the foot of the Minack cliff. Each time he hopes that, like other companies, the designer's vision will be two chairs and a table, but if they did it wouldn't be Mitre. To date there has been - Notre Dame cathedral for Quasimodo, a duck pond for Honk!, heaven knows where for the Hunting of the Snark, Just So was set on the grey, green, greasy Limpopo river, Gulliver travelled to Lilliput and Laputa amongst other places, then there was a Cape Cod whaler for Moby Dick!. 2012 saw the USS Albatross crash-land on the Forbidden Planet. A full-sized fairy-tale castle with working portcullis is perhaps the most challenging to date. He still thinks that The Minack is one of the great venues and a privilege to work at.

Peter Davis (Sir Bedevere, Knight of Ni, Ensemble): Peter is amazed to be back doing another Mitre tour show, as are we! He has now shown off for five Mitre shows and will be back for more, if they will have him! Having always tried to look on the luminescent side of existence, Peter finds his roles a stretch (one physically) and is glad to step up to the challenge. Boldly stepping up to play a knight will be a gas, although he is concerned for anyone downwind on stage! Peter has finally been allowed to show off his love for all things Trojan - has he understood this correctly?

Clare Dempsey (Laker Girl, Minstrel, Ensemble): This is Clare's return to performing in a show with the Mitre Players after last performing with them here at the Minack in *Just So* back in 2006 playing a variety of animals! In fact, after also having played a variety of bird fowl here in Mitres' Honk!, this will be her first time playing human roles on the Minack stage so that will make a nice change! The Minack is one of her favourite places in the world and she can't wait to sing, dance and shake her pompoms here in this fantastic show!

Julia Gibbs (Sir Bob, Ensemble): A Mitre Player it seems since swirling medieval mists and wild boar covered most of southern England, and slapping on woad was the beauty 'must have' product of the day, Julia feels she has finally served her Mitre apprenticeship. Previously seen at the Minack as Regan in King Lear (1998), Honk! (2002), Gulliver's Travels (2008) and more recently in Return to the Forbidden Planet (2012). A lifelong fan of all things Monty Pythonesque, Julia has very much enjoyed being a Knight – particularly the banter, high kicks and horse riding!

Paul Grace (Patsy): Paul is celebrating his tenth quest to perform at the Minack. He's very proud that two of these journeys have resulted in the holy grail of the Minack Trophy: Honk! in 2002 and last year's production of Parade. Other favourite parts include Cookie in Return to the Forbidden Planet, Seymour in Little Shop of Horrors and Armand in The Scarlet Pimpernel. Paul will shortly start training as a drama teacher so hopes this experience guiding a right royal twit will serve him well!

Michael Hall (Mayor of Finland, Minstrel, Prince Herbert's Father, Sir Bors, Ensemble): Michael is making his fifth appearance at the Minack, brought here once again by his trusty steed Fiesta. As an almost-qualified pensions actuary and CODA's treasurer, he loves vague numbers, and has appeared in between none and four hundred shows, favourites including A Midsummer Night's Dream, Once Bitten, Oliver! and Abigail's Party.
