Looking further ahead, to next autumn, we are staging **Catherine Howard** in


the Mitre Theatre, with Tony Rapps directing his first show for us. This period drama has a good script with its own challenges and we are looking forward to having something to get our teeth into!

JULIA ASCOTT: AMANDA

Julia has been a Mitre Player for over 35 years and has been in so many varied productions that she can't remember most of them. She has been in all 4 productions that Charles has directed for Mitres – Vera in **Stepping Out** and Amanda in **Timing** are among her favorite acting roles along with Puck (**The Dream**) at the Globe, and Aldonza (**Man of La Mancha**) & Wicked Witch (**Wizard of Oz**) at the Minack. One of her weirdest roles was while 6 months pregnant as a female Horatio to Neil O'Gorman's Hamlet at the Ashcroft – not great timing but certainly unusual! Unlike Amanda, she is married with 2 teenage sons and although she has previously worked as a voice over artist she now works in a school office.

CHRIS CHAMBERS: DINO



Chris' adaptation of *Gulliver's Travels* (co-written with Andy Rapps) was chosen as the Minack touring show in 2008. "Playing Gulliver in that magical setting is something I will never forget." He is excited to be acting alongside some of the Gulliver cast again, but happy not to be tied to a mast ten feet above the stage with the Atlantic Ocean's spume spuming all over him. Since then Chris has been on tour with The Birmingham Stage Company in their production of *Skellig* which will be transferring to Broadway in March next year – so if you happen to be in New York, come and say hi! He is currently working on a new musical with lan Rae called Olympus!

DAVID ELDER: JULIAN



David discovered the Mitres somewhat late in life, but is now fully indoctrinated! This is his fourth Mitre show, and follows up the fun experience of his first pantomime, where he played the evil Asbad in Ali Baba. Previous Mitre roles were Don Pedro in Gulliver and the Ghost of Christmas Present in Uncle Ebeneezer. David is the son of two actors and remembers well his regular visits to radio studios as a young lad, waiting (im) patiently for Mum to stop blethering in strange accents so he could go home for his tea. It all makes sense now! David received a singing scholarship while at Manchester University, where the highlight was an appearance alongside Hinge and Bracket. He gave it all up to sell razor blades around the world and has been involved in international sales and marketing ever since! David brings some first-hand Sat Nav experience to the production of Timing as he led the team which introduced Tom Tom to the UK. An example of Timing: being grateful for running 20 minutes late while driving through Belgium, and so missing getting on board the Herald of Free Enterprise, which tragically sank in Zeebrugge harbour in 1987.


DIRECTOR'S NOTES

When I saw this play, I was immediately struck by the writing! Having directed many radio commercials, I could relate to the characters and their respective roles within the context of a typical one hour session in a studio in London's Soho. The dialogue is very current with a smattering of references to celebrities that will amuse. I thought......I would love to direct this. Few will have seen anything like this play before! That was the easy bit.....but we needed a really strong cast. All the characters are crucial. As we started rehearsals, I was instantly delighted with the shear wealth of ability and talent that you will see on stage tonight. My immense gratitude goes to all the actors for your commitment and dedication during the production period. The Mitre Players are the first company to be granted permission to perform Timing, it having only just finished its debut run in London at the end of last year. My thanks go to all the wonderful people behind the scenes who have created such an authentic setting befitting of any professional recording studio set up.

CHARLES MARRIOTT: DIRECTOR

This is Charles' forth excursion into directing for the Mitres. Previous shows have been *Habeas Corpus*, *Return to the Forbidden Planet* and *Stepping Out*. "I relish the Stage experience. As a professional Film and Television Director I find the disciplines are so different when there's no camera!" Charles originally trained as an actor way back in 1967 along with a cluster of well known (now!) actresses

such as Jenny Agutter, Jane Seymour and Cherie Lunghi. His mother was a scriptwriter of note and his father was a TV director. He

Charles has made only two appearances in shows for the Mitres, he played Drums in the band at Dawlish for *It's Only Make Believe* and last year played Dr. Fernandez in *Gulliver's Travels*. be Del Boy falling through the gap in the bar in **Only Fools and Horses**.

ALAN GEESON: PRESTON

Having stunned the Mitres with a debut performance as a pirate in **Peter Pan**, Lee followed up as a (what were you?) in **Beauty and the Beast**, and then a period of several years' resting followed, until with perfect timing a call from a fellow Mitre led to Lee taking the role of Phil. It is Lee's first go at proper acting, and he has never seen so many lines in his life-a few more than 'We're doomed!' which was his memorable contribution to **Peter Pan**.



NEIL O'GORMAN: WES

Neil is Scottish and will fight anyone who says he isn't. To Neil, timing is everything. He lives his life by the cherished notion that every second is precious and can never be clawed back. To waste even a moment in fruitless occupation is to diminish the very essence of what it is to be alive.
