Paul Grace – Director

What is Urinetown?

- *Urinetown* is a satirical musical comedy by Greg Kotis and Mark Hollmann.
- First premiered in 2001 at the *American Theatre for Actors* in New York City.
- A parody of traditional musical theater, blending dark humor, social commentary, and a quirky storyline.
- Musical nods to some other well known shows
- The show pokes fun at politics, corporate greed, and social inequality.



The Story of *Urinetown*

- Set in a dystopian future where a severe water shortage has led to a law that all citizens must pay to use public toilets. Anyone who refuses to pay, or pees anywhere but the public toilets is immediately exiled to Urinetown
- The government, led by the corrupt Caldwell B. Cladwell, controls the water and profits from this monopoly.
- The musical follows Bobby Strong, a young man who leads a rebellion against the oppressive system.
- Themes include corporate control, environmental issues, and the power of the people.








Nothing kills a musical like too much exposition... How about bad subject matter? Or a bad title?

Meet the Characters



- Officer Lockstock: (30-60) A cynical and somewhat humorous police officer who serves as a narrator, commenting on the events and often breaking the fourth wall.
- **Little Sally:** (Early teens) One of the poor who use the public amenity and joins the revolution. She makes up a double act with Lockstock, breaking the fourth wall. She's young but strangely savvy for her years.
- **Penelope Pennywise**: (40-60) The tough, no-nonsense manager of the public toilets who is caught between loyalty to the authorities and her own personal interests.
- **Bobby Strong**: (20s) The protagonist who becomes the leader of the revolt against the oppressive government. He is passionate, idealistic, and determined to bring justice.
- **Hope Cladwell**: (Late teen-early 20s) The daughter of the villain, Caldwell B. Cladwell. She falls in love with Bobby and becomes involved in the rebellion. Young and ridiculously naïve and romantic.
- Caldwell B. Cladwell: (40-60) The villain, a corrupt businessman who controls the city's water supply and profits from people's suffering.
